

*Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* are the new names for *Periodicals Contents Index* and *PCI Full Text*. Together, they provide access to a growing archive of more than 16 million article citations from over 5,000 journals in the arts, humanities and social sciences and 500+ journals in full archival format.

*Periodicals Index Online* is the premier resource of its kind – a single index offering comprehensive coverage across thousands of journals in the humanities and social sciences. It is used in libraries around the world: national libraries, university libraries from Tromsø to Tokyo, and public libraries, are all subscribers to *Periodicals Index Online* and thousands of scholars already rely on it for their research.

*Periodicals Archive Online* offers users access to the complete backfiles of a growing body of journals, from a wide range of publishers, all the way back to Volume 1, Issue 1. Users can search through millions of articles to immediately find the full text of important criticism and scholarship, relevant to their research.

## GIVE YOUR RESEARCH A HEAD START

Anyone who needs to locate periodical articles for their research knows it can be a time-consuming process. Even after consulting several indexes, it is likely that you will not have found many references to articles written in the first half of the last century or earlier. Articles in periodicals of more general interest, or those relating more closely to other subject areas may not be catalogued at all.

*Periodicals Index Online* helps you to overcome these obstacles. It provides access to the contents pages for every issue of over 5,000 journals (including previous titles), from their inception to 1995, and includes separate records for more than 16 million journal articles, across 37 key subject areas and 58 languages and dialects.

It catalogues every article in thousands of scholarly journals. It indexes the complete runs of journals, some as far back as 1665. Its coverage is broad: every area of the humanities and social sciences is covered and the *Index* also includes journals of general interest. Moreover, its scope is international.

*Periodicals Index Online* enables you to find every article relevant to your field of study, quickly and efficiently. Time you might once have spent conducting a laborious search of numerous indexes can now be dedicated to the articles themselves.

An experienced team of researchers and editors works with current subscribers and major libraries to identify more journals for inclusion. Many publishers also actively approach *Periodicals Index Online*, to request that their backfile be indexed in the database.

New journals are added regularly each year and the index will continue to grow beyond 5,000 journals and towards 20 million individual articles. Where other electronic indexes tend to cover only the last twenty years or so, or to include only selected articles, *Periodicals Index Online* indexes journals from the seventeenth century onwards, as completely as possible.

## UNLOCK THE POTENTIAL OF YOUR LIBRARY


More than simply a collection of static citations, *Periodicals Index Online* on the World Wide Web is the ideal starting point for research. It not only allows users to identify key journal content but also offers a range of seamless linking options to the library's electronic and print holdings.

**OpenURL-compatible link resolvers:** All citation records in *Periodicals Index Online* are capable of submitting metadata in OpenURL format to a library's link resolver database, where it can be checked against other resources that the library may have (including catalogue records for hard-copy holdings).

***Periodicals Archive Online:*** Users with appropriate access can link directly from citations in the *Index* to the full text of those articles in its sister database, *Periodicals Index Online*.

Every one of the 500+ journals in the *Archive* is also indexed in *Periodicals Index Online* and users with access to both services may choose to use the *Index* interface as a single access point for both.

***JSTOR:*** Likewise, embedded, direct links also take *JSTOR* subscribers straight to their article of choice from within *Periodicals Index Online*. Links to over 459 journals within *JSTOR*'s collections are available.



[Periodicals Archive Online] provides online access to full-text articles from a growing number of periodical backfiles in the humanities and social sciences, covering more than 200 years of scholarship. The content addresses key issues for libraries involved in the provision of academic resources such as acquisition, preservation, storage and delivery.

[It] dramatically increases access to this scholarly material – making more journals available to more people – and can be accessed 24 hours per day, seven days per week, from any connected computer. [Periodicals Archive Online] can also be used to acquire previously un-held journals, to complete library holdings of journal backfiles or to reduce the strain on aging print materials, all without increasing storage and collection management costs.

# ARCHIVE ONLINE

*Periodicals Archive Online* builds upon the indexing in *Periodicals Index Online* and forms a natural companion to its sister database, providing access to an archive of full-text articles from 1770 to 1995.

Currently, the *Archive* contains around 9 million page-images of articles from over 500 journals – offering institutions a virtual library of journals which will continue to grow as more content is digitised and added to the service. In addition, the journals digitised for *Periodicals Archive Online* mirror the international scope of the *Index* by including non-English language content.

Customers can choose to subscribe to *Periodicals Archive Online* or to purchase collections of journals which they then own outright.

The *Archive* programme continues to digitise and preserve additional content in the form of major interdisciplinary collections. At present there are five of these, with a sixth in progress:

- Collection I (100 journals, complete)
- Collection II (100 journals, complete)
- Collection III (75 journals, complete)
- Collection IV (75 journals, complete)
- Collection V (75 journals, complete)
- Collection VI (75 journals, released 2006-7)

In addition, selected journals from these collections are now being made available in smaller, thematic collections:

- Literature Collection (25 journals)
- History Collection (25 journals)
- Spanish Language Collection (27 journals)
- Philosophy and Theology/Religion Collection (25 journals)

# TWO SERVICES, TWO ELEGANT AND EFF



*Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* both have their own individual sites – in order to maximise the strengths of each database.

Users who want instant access to full-text content that they can read immediately, or who wish to search within the text of articles, can visit the dedicated *Archive* website (<http://pao.chadwyck.co.uk/>), whilst those who wish to see all of the citations relating to their field of interest can use the *Periodicals Index Online* site (<http://pio.chadwyck.co.uk/>) to search across all 16 million+ records in the *Index*.

Any article citation found in *Periodicals Index Online* which is included in full text in *Periodicals Archive Online* will feature a direct link to that article in the *Archive*, for users with access to both services.

Both sites have been designed and developed together to share the same tools, navigation and features, including:

**Quick Search and Advanced Search:** In addition to the traditional full, “Advanced” search screen, where users can take advantage of the detailed fielding of *Periodicals Index Online* data to search by keyword, article title keyword, author name, journal title, language, journal subject, date and ISSN, both the *Index* and the *Archive* now feature a simplified one-box “Quick Search” tool, which appears on the majority of pages in the site – allowing them to perform queries instantly, from wherever they are.

**Instant Filtering of Results:** A major new feature that has been developed with the transition of *PCI* and *PCI Full Text* to *Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* is the ability to focus lists of results by filtering them according to a set of live-updated criteria, based on a summary of their search – Journal Title, Language, Date, Journal Subject. The filters can be combined with one another to further refine a results set, without going back to conduct increasing numbers of repeated searches.

# TWO WEBSITES, ONE EFFICIENT INTERFACE



A user who has searched the entire database for a list of records containing “Freud” may choose to limit their results to just those results from English-language psychology journals, or to look at those from a specific publication (e.g. the one containing the greatest number of hits).

**Marked List and MyArchive:** Users will be able to keep track of selected records during their session using the Marked List, and even store them to return to on another day with the personalised MyArchive feature – to which they can also save useful searches and from where they can download or email citations.

**Information Resources:** Additional tools for administrators and users can be found in this section in both *Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* – including freely-downloadable MARC records, password-protected usage statistics (including COUNTER reports), title lists and linking request forms.

## SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS

*Periodicals Index Online and Periodicals Archive Online are optimised to operate with Netscape Navigator 7 or higher, Microsoft Internet Explorer Version 5.0 or higher and Firefox 1.0 and above. Use of these browsers is strongly recommended.*

## HARDWARE REQUIREMENTS

*The minimum specification of hardware is determined by the requirements of the Internet browser software which is being used to access *Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online*.*

# ALS INDEX ONLINE AND ONLINE TO YOUR LIBRARY

**Linking:** Libraries can connect *Periodicals Index Online* to their OpenURL-compliant link resolver so that users can look, from within the *Index*, for available content in other databases (or in hard copy, via the library catalogue).

*Periodicals Archive Online* can also act as a destination for anybody using such a mechanism to find material indexed or cited in other OpenURL-compliant sources.

**MARC Records:** Both the *Index* and the *Archive* offer easily-downloadable sets of free MARC records for all journals, which libraries can load into their catalogue systems. These contain durable links to journal records in the 856 field.

**Z39.50:** *Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* are also easy to connect with federated search tools using the Z39.50 standard. Libraries implementing a single-search tool for quick access to resources will have no difficulty in integrating these resources with their other materials.

**Citation Management:** Bibliographic records in *Periodicals Index Online* and *Periodicals Archive Online* can be directly downloaded into the most common citation management tools or saved in a suitable format for transfer by users into their bibliographies.
